And The Defense Wins Published 4-26-17 by DRI

Franklin D. Beahm and Christopher Gerald Otten



In early May 2016, <u>Franklin D. Beahm</u>, a partner in the New Orleans firm **Beahm and Green**, defended a hospital liability claim in the Civil District Court in New Orleans, *Buggage v. Touro Infirmary*. The plaintiffs were family members of a since deceased patient who claimed the environment in the hospital following Hurricane Katrina caused or contributed to the plaintiff-patient's loss of her toe and accompanying injuries as a result of the loss of the ability to

provide hyperbaric (intensive oxygen therapy) treatments. The plaintiffs sought damages in the amount of \$1.4 million. The case was tried to the judge, who took the matter under advisement and entered a defense judgment in favor of the hospital with written reasons in July.

Again in late May 2016, Mr. Beahm and associate Chris Otten defended another hospital liability claim centering on the post-Katrina environment, Favret v. Touro Infirmary. The plaintiffs were a patient and his wife who claimed the conditions in the hospital caused or exacerbated the plaintiff-patient's pre-existing bacterial infection along his lower spine. The plaintiffs sought damages in the amount of \$600,000, plus \$20,000 in loss of consortium damages for the wife. The case was tried to the judge, who took the matter under advisement and entered a defense judgment in favor of the hospital with written reasons in December.
